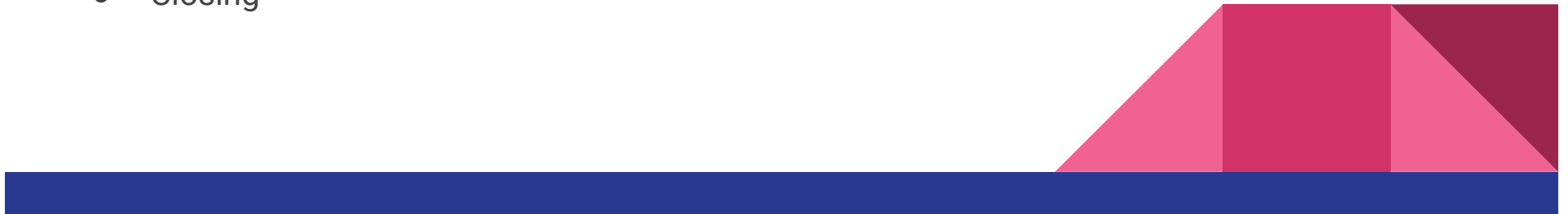

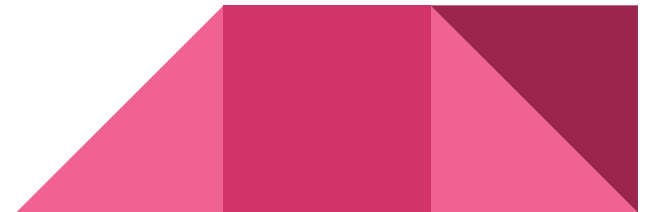


Starting a Club (*from scratch*)

5. Fill out a ton of paperwork (constitution, bylaws, articles)

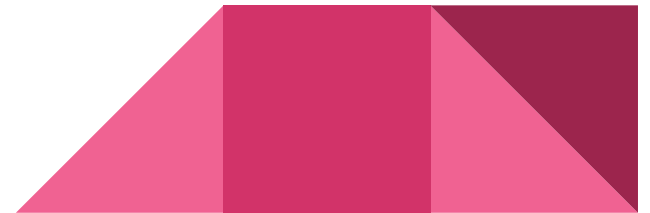
5.5 Identify BOD

- Program Committee Derek Wieske (*identifies keynote speaker for club meetings*)

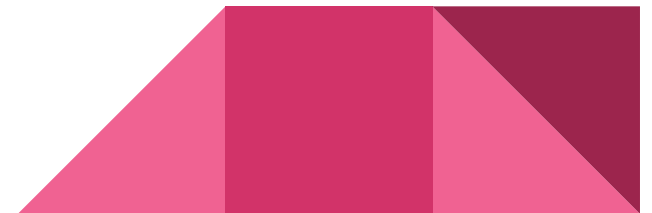

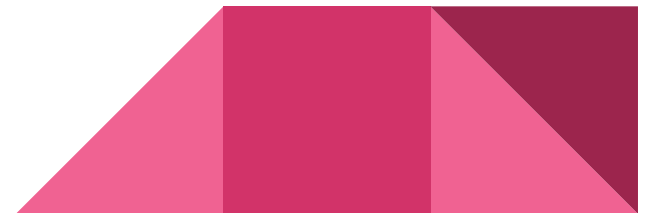

THE 4-WAY TEST STORY

IN 1932, HERBERT TAYLOR, A ROTARY CLUB OF CHICAGO MEMBER, SAVED A FALTERING ALUMINUM COMPANY FROM THE BRINK OF BANKRUPTCY BY DISTINGUISHING ITSELF FROM THE COMPETITION BY DEVELOPING HIS 4-WAY TEST. THIS HAS BEEN A LITMUS TEST OF FAIRNESS, HONESTY, AND INTEGRITY. ROTARY ADOPTED THE 4-WAY TEST IN 1943 TO UNDERSCORE ITS VALUE OF BUSINESS ETHICS. THE 4-WAY TEST HAS LONG SERVED AS AN ETHICAL COMPASS FOR MEMBERS TO LIVE BY THEIR PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL RELATIONSHIPS.
